Presentation of the Best Kept Village Trophy

The presentation of the Rubery Owen Holdings Ltd Trophy took place at midday on Monday 23rd October next to the trophy pole, which has been erected on the green at the corner of Newport Road and Jolt Lane. In the recent Best Kept Village Awards Haughton won the title of Best Kept Village in Stafford Area, which brings with it the prizes of the trophy pole, a brass plaque and a cheque for £200.

Cllr Mike Allen, Chairman of Haughton Parish Council opened the ceremony and Cllr Derek Warbrick, Haughton BKV Team Leader and Co-ordinator gave a review of this year's campaign.
