## Parish Council Chairman's Annual Report

At the May 2011 election Peter Lawrence and Peter Rowley stood down as councillors and I thank them both for their contributions. Gill Anslow and Mike Little joined the five remaining councillors to form the new council. Cllr. Anslow became the council's representative on the Village Hall Committee and continues to manage the parish website. Cllr. Little joined the playing field committee and took over editorship of the council's quarterly newsletter.

The concurrent allowance to the parish was again reduced and, in order to maintain local services, councillors raised the precept by an average of £1.41 per household. Services include grass-cutting, amenity van visits, provision of dog gloves, support for the Village Hall, help with maintenance of the churchyard and provision of a warden at the playing field.

An excellent community effort, ably managed by Peter Lawrence, saw the village win the Best Kept Village (Large Section) in Staffordshire, BKV in Stafford District overall, and a unique award presented by the chairman of Staffordshire County Council for the children's poster display. The village received further honours by securing a Silver Gilt award from Heart of England in Bloom, and our thanks go to Cllr. Warbrick, vice-chairman, for ensuring those judges saw all the village's good points. The village is again entered in the BKV and Heart of England competitions and Maxine Hutt has assumed the coordination role with Peter Lawrence and Cllr. Warbrick in support. The Garden Guild is now running the village garden and hanging basket competitions and this year will see extensive sponsorship from local businesses.

After consultation and research, suppliers were chosen for the playing field equipment and funding secured to enable the £50K project to proceed. The council gratefully acknowledges financial backing from Staffordshire Environmental Fund, Stafford Borough Council and Staffordshire County Council who jointly contributed 96% with the parish council providing the rest. The project was managed by Cllr. Warbrick with assistance from Cllr. Little, the clerk Julie Hill, and Julie Sleight and the youngsters themselves who chose the equipment. Adult Exercise equipment is to be added to the playing field with financial aid from Sport England and Route One. Cllr. Warbrick is again coordinating this exercise with the playing field committee and help from Julie Hill. The council wishes to thank Reg Mathews, the playing field warden who visits the area regularly to monitor the state of equipment, log his visits and alert the council should repairs be necessary. The playing field is also checked for any dangerous materials.

Over the Christmas period the now famous village lights won admiration from far and wide and, together with the annual post-Christmas tractor run including more than 60 entrants, over £7,000 was handed to local charities.

This is the Queen's Jubilee Year, and Haughton will be on the route for the Olympic Torch. The parish council will provide financial support for these events including plenty of bunting.

Lastly, the council's thanks to the clerk. Julie is the proper officer and the responsible financial officer of the council. She advises the council on legal, financial and procedural matters and again ensured the council obtained a clean report from the Audit commission in 2011. She also shouldered the work involved in the election process and conducted council business during the interregnum.



#### The Olympic Torch . . . .

... was carried through Haughton Village on the 30th May 2012, starting just after 5.12pm. The runners were Adele Bisbey and Steve Girdler and they carried the torch in two stages from Station Road, along the A518 through the village to Prince Avenue, and it was then taken by convoy into Stafford. Large crowds lined the A518 in Haughton to celebrate a remarkable once-in-a-lifetime event.

As part of this procession, there was a significant police outrider presence which certainly kept the crowds interested as the motorcycles zoomed through the village while spectators awaited the torch. Some photographs of this Haughton procession also appeared on the BBC

#### **UPDATE** — Jim Jarvis Playing Field facilities:

The Parish Council have a programme underway to install extra equipment in the Playing Field to provide exercise equipment for adults living in the village. The survey for this has been completed, grant applications submitted and we await the outcome of our funding application. More as soon as we hear. . . .

In addition, there have been recent instances where other parts of the village such as the Village Hall and Retail shop car parks have been used as playing areas. These are <u>privately owned</u> areas and should not be used in this fashion. Local Police have been informed and they will be keeping an eye on this use.

Using these locations for play purposes should not continue.

The broadband survey, which has been conducted in partnership with Stoke-on-Trent City Council, helped form the case for Government funding to help private sector providers improve broadband in Staffordshire. The Government has announced that £7,400,000 will be made

Staffordshire County Councillor Mark Winnington, Cabinet Member for Environment and Assets, said: "We share the Government's commitment to improving the broadband network and this funding is most welcome. It will help us to work with broadband companies to improve the services they provide to residents and businesses throughout Staffordshire".
