Best Kept Village Update

Following on from last year's tremendous success in the County Best Kept Village (BKV) competition, it is now time to restart the programme to defend Haughton's well-earned 2011 title for this new year.

The first step has been to appoint a programme coordinator to take over Peter Lawrence's role, who after 3 years, is taking a back seat this time, and we are pleased to announce that **Maxine Hutt** has agreed to take over the baton from Peter. Peter will however still be involved in the communication and publicity side of our BKV work.

Maxine's first step has been to schedule a number of "Pick-Me-Up" sessions. These are sadly not related to normal remedies (!!), but are to work with friends and neighbours to tidy up the village and help to retain our award — many people contributed to last year's successful campaign and it is hoped that even more will become involved in 2012.



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Dog Fouling Issues

It is sad to have to report that there has recently been an increase in the instances where dog faeces have not been picked up by dog owners or walkers. This has been especially apparent near the village school, which of course means that children can be bringing the problem into the school on their shoes, or bringing the mess back to their homes.

This is an important issue and we, the Parish Council, feel that it is appropriate to reemphasise the following main points:

- It is the responsibility of the owner or walker to clean up after their dog(s)
- By law, under the 2006 Dog Control Order, it is an offence to fail to remove dog faeces, punishable up to a maximum penalty of £1000 in a magistrate's court, or via an authorised officer of an authority who can issue a fixed penalty between £50 and £80. There is clearly a need for greater diligence in this area which we will be addressing.
- Throughout Haughton there are convenient supplies of dog gloves to help with this cleaning-up process and bins where the faeces can be left. This is all paid for by the Parish Council
- Once dog fouling has been picked up it must be put into one of the bins and not left on the pathway, roadside or hedge
- As well as being unsightly and unpleasant, dog faeces are dangerous to humans in that it can, on occasion, lead to contracting a disease known as toxocariasis. This can have several drastic effects including blindness and rheumatic, neurologic and asthmatic symptoms

Remember: dogs can't behave irresponsibly—only owners can.




The Olympic Torch
